James is an active member of the Antitrust Law Section of the American Bar Association and serves on the editorial board for the *Antitrust Report* (LexisNexis).

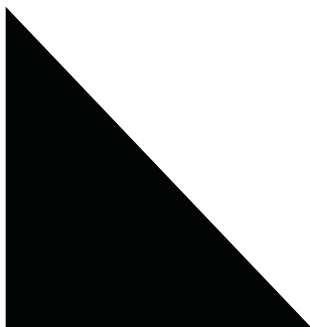

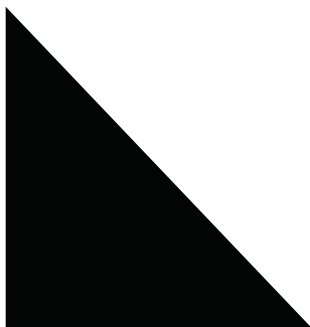
