Victoria Lu's antitrust practice focuses on civil litigation, government investigations, and merger review. Most recently, Victoria has been involved in defending Tyson Foods in federal class action and multi-district lawsuits alleging price fixing of various proteins and defending Independence Blue Cross in federal class action and multi-district lawsuits challenging the Blue Cross Blue Shield health insurance system. Other recent work includes assisting in the successful closure of multiple no-poach investigations by the DOJ and analyzing antitrust risk for contemplated acquisitions and divestitures.

Victoria also maintains an active pro bono practice, including assisting Afghan refugees obtain asylum and representing a prison inmate in a federal civil rights case against government officials.

Victoria attended Boston University School of Law, where she served as a Notes Editor for the *American Journal of Law and Medicine*.
